#### From the Principal's Desk

Dear Parents, Guardians and Community Members:

Welcome Back! On behalf of the Round Hill School staff, I would like to offer a warm welcome to everyone new and returning to Round Hill School! At Round Hill School, we firmly believe in the BRSD motto, *Every Student, Every Day, A Success*, and we work hard to ensure students are taught to behave in a manner that is *respectful*, put in their best *effort*, have a positive *attitude*, and demonstrate their *leadership* abilities. We take pride in our community connections and partnerships that enhance the educational programming for our students, especially in our Agricultural Program. Our staff is committed to meeting the needs of all students and a student-centered philosophy is the overall priority. Students First!

Here are the upcoming activities in September:

#### Pancake Breakfast for ALL (Thursday, September 5th)!

The staff of Round Hill School invites you to our Welcome Back Pancake Breakfast! This event will take place from 8:00 until 9:30 am the morning of Thursday, September 5th. Everyone is welcome to come out and enjoy pancakes and sausages and conversation! We ask that you bring your own plates and cutlery for this event, staff will supply the rest!

#### **Cell Phones**

The news story coming into September was cell phones, and what each School Board across Canada was going to put in place. At Round Hill School, our procedure is simple. Cell phones can be a distraction in class so to eliminate that distraction we are asking that students in grades K-6 keep their cell phones at home. If students feel that they need to bring them to school, we ask that they leave them turned off in their lockers from 8:45-3:30. This really isn't a change from last year. Students in grades 7-9 are asked to leave their cell phones in my office when they come to school. They can then come get them at lunch and then leave them in my office until 3:30, when they can come pick them up before they go home. The BRSD Administrative Procedure (AP 135) is linked here.

#### Fall Harvest

The garden harvest will take place soon! When we have a firm date and time, we will let everyone know. Right now, the Round Hill Renaissance Agricultural Foundation is having a General Meeting on September 12th and we hope to have a harvest date soon after!

#### **Bus Passes**

Battle River School Division (BRSD) is providing bus passes to all students who live in the country and take a route bus to school. "BusPlanner Web is a program that will mitigate the back and forth between transportation, bus drivers and administration."

BRSD will provide each student with a bus pass and a holder, which can be attached to their backpack. Students will be asked to scan their pass when they get on the bus and then again when they exit the bus. Realizing that this is the first time rural students will have bus passes, it may take a few weeks to iron out the kinks!

#### **Monthly Hall Meals**

The Elks Club of Round Hill is again pleased to sponsor the monthly hall meals which the junior high students prepare. These meals will take place on the third Tuesday from October to May. Everyone is welcome to come and eat with our students! The meals start around 11:50 and end around 1:00. We will let everyone know if one of the dates needs to be switched. The tentative dates for our meals this year are: October 22, November 19, December 10, January 21, February 18, March 18, April 22 and May 20.

#### Junior High Volleyball (Noon, Thursday, September 5th)

Junior High volleyball will get underway on Thursday at **noon recess**. This will be the first practice of the volleyball season!! This practice will include both boys and girls from Grades 6-9. The intent is to have both a Girls' and Boys' Team. Forms are being sent home today for parents. These forms outline the process parents and guardians should follow if they would like to drive students to extra-curricular activities. More information regarding volleyball will be sent out as we receive more information.

#### **Real-Time Reporting**

BRSD and Round Hill School are excited to announce a significant change in how we will be reporting academic progress. Traditionally, report cards served as a snapshot of your child's performance at specific points in the school year. However, with our transition to PowerSchool four years ago, we are now able to offer a more dynamic and informative way to keep you updated on your child's academic journey. Teachers will be reporting on your child's progress throughout the year on various assignments. Please contact Mrs. McManus if you have not yet signed up for PowerSchool. Traditional BRSD schools like Round Hill will no longer be sending home report cards. A letter which explains Real-Time Reporting will be sent home via School Messenger.

#### **Enrolment Verification**

On August 7th you should have received an email from BRSD linking you to a form to re-enroll your child(ren) into the 2024/25 school year. The email contains a link that takes you directly to the School Engage login. All registration forms should be completed before the end of September. If you require assistance contact Mrs. McManus at the school.

#### **Our Gym Floor Sparkles!**

Our gym floor looks really nice and we would like to keep it this way. The students did a really good job keeping the gym floor clean last year and we would like to continue this trend! We are requiring ALL students to have two pairs of footwear - an outdoor pair and a pair of runners for the gym and inside our building. The indoor runners MUST have non-marking soles.

#### Terry Fox Run (Thursday, September 12)

The Terry Fox Run will take place on Thursday, September 12. We will walk with the students from the school to the church and back again. Parents and community members are welcome to join! We will start this walk right after the afternoon recess - approximately 2:10.

#### Communication

Please contact your child's teacher if you have any questions, concerns or information that teachers need to know to support your child. Communication coming from the school to home will come from a variety of places. The school will use School Messenger, phone calls, texts and emails and school newsletters. Some teachers use other web-based communication programs such as Seesaw and Remind. If you are not receiving emails or text messages, please contact the school to ensure we have your correct email address and phone number. Always remember to call the school if you have any questions at all!

#### Communication at the End of the Day

One of the most important things is that you contact the school **PRIOR to 3:00** if you have a message for your children regarding end of the day activities. It is not uncommon for 10-15 parents to call the school at the end of the day to have Mrs. McManus relay a message to their children. Mrs. McManus is extremely busy between 3:00-3:30 and it would be really helpful **if your call came before 3:00.** 

#### Safety at the End of the Day

Student safety is a priority and we ask you to follow the direction of staff members at the end of the day when you are picking up students. If you are coming to pick up your child, please park along the west side of the school in the grass so the gravel part of the parking lot is in front of you. In this way, no one has to back out and all the students can see you. If you do land up parking on the east side, please park along the parking barrier. If you need to be at an appointment and are rushing out after school, it might be best to show up early (3:15) and pick up your child. Just call Mrs. McManus and let her know and she will make sure your child is ready to go!



Traditionally, report cards served as a snapshot of your child's performance at specific points in the school year. However, with our transition to PowerSchool four years ago, we are now able to offer a more dynamic and informative way to keep you updated on your child's academic journey.

Effective September 2024, printed report cards will no longer be sent home as a progress report. Instead, we are embracing digital reporting through the PowerSchool platform. Here's why we believe this change is beneficial for both you and your child:

- Real-Time Information: With PowerSchool, you can access your child's academic progress in real-time. This means you can stay up-to-date on their learning journey whenever you want, rather than waiting for periodic report cards.
