Presentation

The Round Hill School Council is sponsoring a presentation from the Alberta Wellness Center on Friday, March 14th. This presentation will be for students from grades 5-9 as well as parents. Monica Arnold, Registered Psychologist, from the Alberta Wellness Center for Eating Disorders (AWCED) will be presenting at Round Hill School. The presentation to parents will be from 3:30-4:30 on Friday, March 14.

The Alberta Wellness Center for Eating Disorders is a multidisciplinary practice that specializes in the treatment of eating disorders and eating related struggles, across the lifespan. The center integrates best practice guidelines, evidence-based treatments, and promising innovative approaches to provide their clients hope for a meaningful and long-lasting recovery. They believe that knowledge and awareness are essential elements to eating disorder prevention. Their efforts towards advocacy and community outreach have a strong focus on fostering positive relationships with food, bodies and movement.

The presenter, Monica Arnold, has specialized training in, and a passion for, working with folks navigating eating disorders and other disruptions with food and body image. She has a particular interest in providing education surrounding diet culture, weight bias, and colonial ways of viewing bodies in hopes of inviting those around her to begin unpacking the oppressive ways they have learned to view their own bodies, food and the diverse bodies of others. Monica frequently presents at conferences, primarily targeting educators and school communities, to encourage a shift in how nutrition and body image are discussed and approached in school environments


This supports the goals of the International Student Program to develop global competencies and understanding of different cultures within our own BRSD students and to create excitement about new experiences.






